## HOW TO BECOME A CHRISTIAN

Jesus Christ, the Son of God, died for us and rose from the dead, making salvation available as a gift (John 3:16; Romans 6:23). In order to benefit from this 8reat sacrificial love, one must receive God's grace through faith in Christ and obedience to him (Romans 5:1-2; Hebrews 5:9). To become a Christian, the Bible teaches that we must believe in and put our trust in Christ (John 8:24), turn away from a life of sin (Luke 13:3), confess Jesus as Lord (Romans 10:9-10), and be baptized for the forgiveness of sins (Acts 2:38; 22:16). ## WRESTLING WITH SELF FORGIVENESS <br> By Kevin Cauley

Perhaps one of the greatest mental struggles that we face as Christians is forgiving ourselves. We know our lives better than anyone else, and we also know our sins more than anyone else. Private sins shared only with God haunt us, and while God forgives $100 \%$, the history of those sins can eat away at our psyche. More than that, sins that we commit in public may endure within our minds for years, constantly reminding us of our failures and creating feelings of inferiority. The truth is that most people do not even remember our foibles; they are usually preoccupied with their own troubled pasts, and good, decent people forgive and forget. So, the most pressing issue is how do we forgive ourselves?

We need to know that God loves us and forgives us. Sometimes people say to themselves, "God could never forgive me for what I have done." That is not true. He gave the highest price that He could give for us, His only begotten Son. Why would He hold back on us when He was willing to give everything for us? That is Paul's point in Romans 8:32, "He who did not spare His own Son, but delivered Him up for us all, how shall He not with Him also freely give us all things?" God is generous in forgiveness. Consider the case of the thief on the cross. If Jesus forgave that sinful man who insulted Him just a few hours before, He will certainly forgive us. John wrote, "If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness" ( 1 John 1:9). We can be assured of God's forgiveness. In the battle to eliminate negative thoughts, we must pray to God about matters out of our control. If we have done all that we can, let God have it. We may need to pray about it several
 times. The effort is worth it. By praying, we can learn to let go of our past. Philippians 4:6-7 says, "Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication, with thanksgiving, let your requests be made known to God; and the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus."

For many, the problem is that we do not want to let go. We want to control and "fix" things. This attitude is deceptive. It does not eliminate the past but reinforces our failures by getting us to dwell on them. If we think we can "fix" or "control" things, we will not let the past go, and it will continue to haunt us. We do not need to be a "fixer" or have "control." If we want peace, we will give it to God and let it go from our thoughts entirely. If we will trust God completely, we can let go of our past and go forward, but we cannot hang onto those things. If we do not let them go, God cannot take them. He will not force us to surrender them. We must surrender them willingly.
