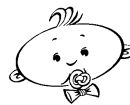

## Some Things That Teachers Like About Parents

1. Parents who attend Bible school regularly.
2. Parents who help their children attend regularly.
3. Parents who help their children be in class on time.
4. Parents who speak well of Bible classes, pointing out the good things; parents who “boost” rather than “knock.” (If you see a problem, talk to the teacher!)
5. Parents who are fair-minded, agreeable, and unselfishly helpful to the teacher with all her classroom problems.
6. Parents who appreciate the efforts of others to help their children. (And express their appreciation.)
7. Parents who are real partners with class teachers in the world’s greatest work — that of causing people to think, choose, act, and feel, as God would have them think, choose, act, and feel.
8. Parents who set a time to help their children get their Bible lesson.
9. Parents who maintain discipline in the home so that the teacher will have less discipline problems in their classrooms.
10. Parents who teach their children the proper attitude for worship, both in the classroom and in public worship.

## The Powerful Tool of the Bible Teacher
